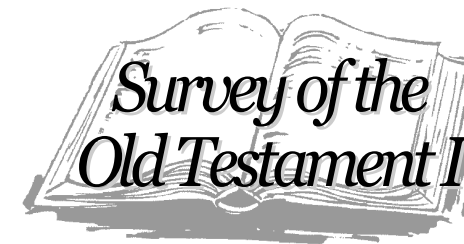

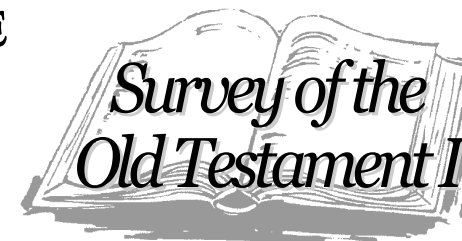

I. THE REVELATION OF THE OLD TESTAMENT SCRIPTURES

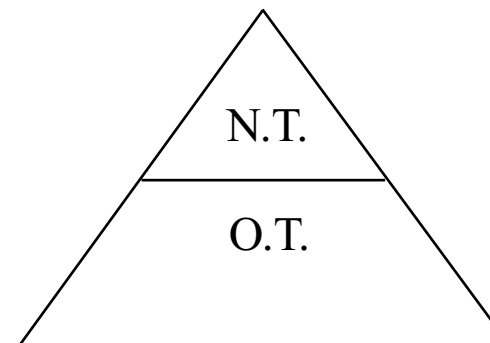
- A. Its purpose
 - *The Bible is the written revelation of God.
 - The O.T. is not merely about people and events; it reveals to us the true and living God.
- B. Its overview
 1. Written by over 30 human penman during a time period of 1,200 years
 2. Makes up approximately 2/3 of the Bible
 3. Covers 4,000 years of history
 4. Contains over 300 specific prophecies of Jesus Christ

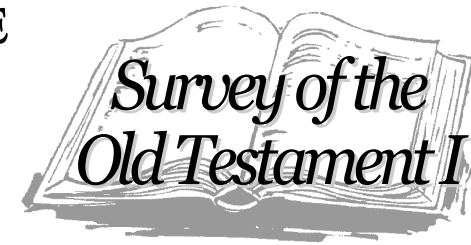
II. THE REASONS FOR STUDYING THE OLD TESTAMENT SCRIPTURES

- A. It provides the background for Christ's work.
- B. It reveals eternal principles that never change.
- C. It foretells future events that are fulfilled in the N.T.
- D. It provides amplified commentary on N.T. passages.
- E. It gives a detailed history of the nation of Israel.
- F. It reveals the heart of our God.

III. THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN THE OLD AND NEW TESTAMENTS

- A. The Bible is one Book, yet it naturally divides itself into the Old (former) Testament ("covenant") and the New Testament.
- B. We find truths in the O.T. in *seed* form; we find the same truths in the N.T. in *fully developed* form.
- C. The O.T. and N.T. *complete* one another.
- D. The O.T. is a *broad base* upon which the N.T. builds.
 - *As you journey through this progressive revelation, the focal point narrows to the Person of Jesus Christ (Hebrews 1:1-3).
